■World Refugee Day

The United Nations has destined June 20 as "The World Refugee Day" to honor refugees around the world. It is "an occasion to build empathy and understanding of their plight and to recognize their resilience in rebuilding their lives" (UNHCR). ■ Tama Campus "International Students Exchange"

■ Support for Students from Ukraine

Hosei University provides support for Ukrainian students displaced from their homeland due to the current crisis. We offer the opportunity of short-term study to a limited number of students, as well as economic support for those admitted. Applicants will go through document screening as well as an interview, and at the earliest, the passing students will join Hosei University this Fall semester.

■ Spring Semester Study Abroad Fair

The Study Abroad Fair was held at the Media Lounge in Sotobori Building from June 14 – 16. Booths were set up by agents outside campus which provided consultation with students interested in studying abroad. In addition, students could pick up pamphlets and materials containing essential information about scholarship and so on at an information corner. About 100 students visited the consultation booths, and a lot more visited the information corner.
