

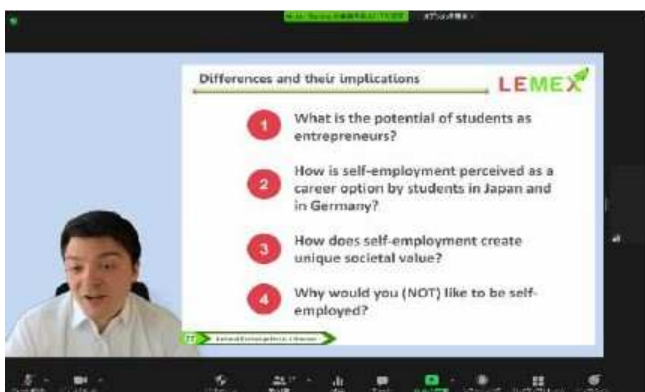


■ Student Online Event with Bremen University

On May 31, more than 20 students from Bremen University and Hosei University shared their ideas in English in this event focusing on ‘Self-employment as an alternative career opportunity and its impact on the society’. The event began with a lecture delivered by Mr. Jan Harima from Bremen University, followed by small group discussions on their views of self-employment and its social implications. At the end, a student from each group reported on the ideas shared in the group. The discussions revealed the different ways of thinking about career in the two societies, and students also appreciated the chance for an in-depth exchange of ideas.

The Global Education Center hosts regular online events with partner universities, and many students participate in these events regularly. These events will continue to be held, in the hope of boosting students’ interest and motivation in studying abroad.

Tama Campus, this event attracted 37 international and Japanese students on the 26th of May. Students from the International Exchange Circle, *FITus*, took the lead in the event, organizing online games to facilitate exchanges between international and Japanese students. Not only did they play games but after the games, students also got the chance to talk with one another. Japanese students expressed appreciation for the opportunity to interact with international students, while international students couldn’t wait to get to campus to talk directly with Japanese students. 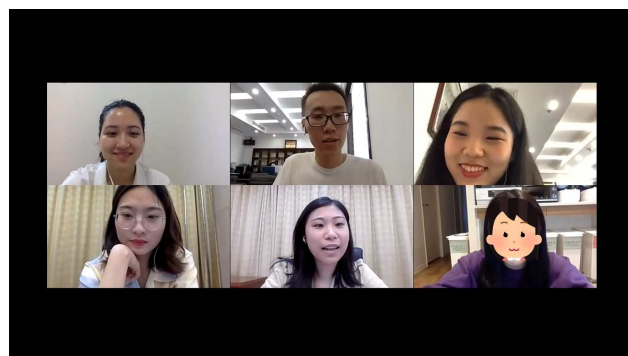

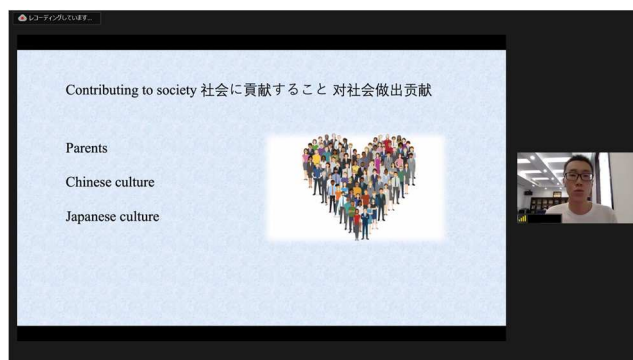

■ Hosei University Students Participated in the “JENESYS2020” Online Event of Chinese and Japanese University Students

The “Japan-East Asia Network of Exchange for Students and Youths” is a program aimed at facilitating understanding of Japan, which is also promoted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. This event is part of this program and was hosted by the Japan-China Friendship Center to facilitate mutual understanding between Japanese and Chinese students and construct a sustainable social network. About 20 students from each country participated. There was active participation in discussion in English on the topic, “my ideal way of working”, as well as presentations in their respective native language (with translation), followed by comments by Professor Tomoko Ako from Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, College of Arts and Sciences, the University of Tokyo. A Hosei University student appreciated the chance to learn about Chinese students' sense of value and how it differs from that of their Japanese counterparts, while a Chinese
