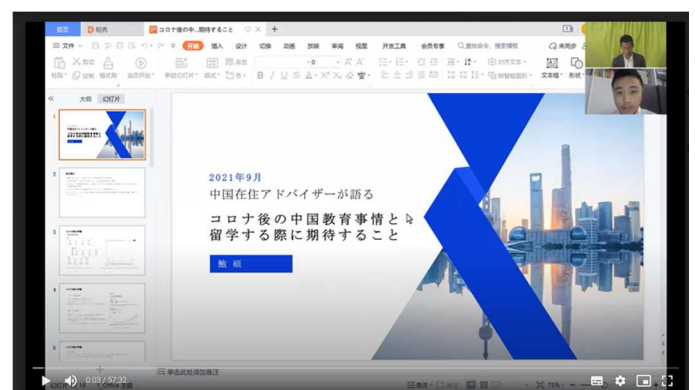
### ■ Exchange students from overseas

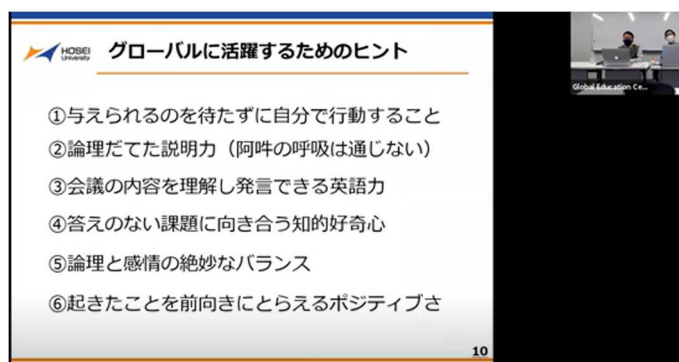
### ■ Chiyoda ward consortium lecture

On September 10, the advisor to the Academic Strategy and Planning Office residing in Tenjin in China, Bao Shuo, gave a talk on the theme of education in post-pandemic China and what Chinese university and high school students expect from studying abroad in Japan. About 50 people, including teaching and administrative staff from other universities in the area, attended the lecture, showing a keen interest in the theme. It was a great opportunity to pick up important hints on international exchange in the post-pandemic era.

This event jointly organized by the Career Center and the Global Education Center on September 28 attracted 107 participants.
