

■Japanese Culture Seminar for International Exchange

On July 6th, 41 students participated in a seminar aimed at facilitating international communication through thinking about Japanese culture.

International exchange is defined not only by learning about a foreign culture, but also about sharing about one's own culture. Students who have studied overseas have also reported not being able to answer questions about Japanese culture. This seminar caters not only to the needs of these students and foreign students, but it appeals to a wider audience interested in learning more broadly and deeply about the Japanese culture. Indeed, more than half of the attendees reported that they joined the seminar out of pure interest, without intending or having the chance to study abroad or engage in international exchange. However, this is of course about international exchange centered on a deeper exploration of Japanese culture.

In this seminar, Mr. Nagai Masato (senior priest (*negi*) of Kamoi Hachiman Shrine, and Yokosuka City Council Member) presented on 'Thinking about Communication from a Religious Perspective'. Rather than focusing only on textbook knowledge, he also drew on what he has gained from his own experience to explore the topic, covering also the place of religion for people overseas, how Japanese rely on unspoken mutual understanding (*ishin denshin*) in interpersonal communication, and so on.
